2023 COMPETITIONS

REGULATIONS

All Competitions are "MEMBERS ONLY". Invites can exceptionally participate in the competition but will not be qualified for the final results.

Each competition is played on the Par 72 and Par 64 courses.

The handicap limit for the Par 72 is 18,4 for all competitions.

The Committee can decide to change the handicap conditions in function of the number of participants. The Committee reserves also the right to close the entry list when the number of competitors reaches the limit.

The Committee can decide to limit competitions to Handicap Active players only or to keep NON-ACTIVE players out of the Prizes. The Committee can decide to change the competitions' formulas if playing conditions require so.

Competitors who fail to present themselves on the starting tee on time will be penalized 2 strokes; a delay exceeding 5 minutes may involve disqualification. Sanctions will be taken against players who are not present at the start without justification.

The 1st net prize has precedence over all other prizes (gross, senior, junior etc.).

In the event of equal scores, all prizes shall be decided over the last 9-6-3-12-15-1 holes respectively.

The Committee reserves the right to take any action necessary for the good running of a competition.

All disputes are subject to the arbitration of the competition committee which decision is final.

READY GOLF

R&A RECOMMENDATIONS

To improve the pace of play on our courses, please read the R&A recommendations here below.

"Ready golf" is not appropriate in match play due to the strategy involved between opponents and the need to have a set method for determining which player plays first. However, in stroke play formats it is only the act of agreeing to play out of turn to give one of the players an advantage that is prohibited. On this basis, it is permissible for administrators to encourage "ready golf" in stroke play, and there is strong evidence to suggest that playing "ready golf" does improve the pace of play. For example, in a survey of Australian golf clubs conducted by Golf Australia, 94% of clubs that had promoted "ready golf" to their members enjoyed some degree of success in improving pace of play, with 25% stating that they had achieved 'satisfying success'.

When "ready golf" is being encouraged, players have to act sensibly to ensure that playing out of turn does not endanger other players.

"Ready golf" should not be confused with being ready to play, which is covered in the Player Behaviour section of this Manual.

The term "ready golf" has been adopted by many as a catch-all phrase for several actions that separately and collectively can improve pace of play. There is no official definition of the term, but examples of "ready golf" in action are:

- Hitting a shot when safe to do so if a player farther away faces a challenging shot and is taking time to assess his options
- Shorter hitters playing first from the tee or fairway if longer hitters must wait
- Hitting a tee shot if the person with the honour is delayed in being ready to play
- Hitting a shot before helping someone to look for a lost ball
- Putting out even if it means standing close to someone else's line
- Hitting a shot if a person who has just played from a greenside bunker is still farthest from the hole but is delayed due to raking the bunker
- When a player's ball has gone over the back of a green, any
 player closer to the hole but chipping from the front of the
 green should play while the other player is having to walk to
 her/his ball and assess her/his shot
- Marking scores upon immediate arrival at the next tee, except that the first player to tee off marks her/his card immediately after teeing off

Local rules and regulations

Out of bounds (Rule 2.1)

Out of bounds is defined by the course hedges, fences and white stakes.

During play of hole 1 of the 72, the fairway of hole 18 of Par 64 to the right-hand side is out of bounds. During play of hole 9 of the Par 64, the fairway of hole 13 Par 72 to the right-hand side is out of bounds.

The line of the fairway is delimited by the sprinklers of the fairway. The driving range is out of bounds (delimited by white stakes)

All hedges, fences, and stakes are treated as boundary objects.

Abnormal course conditions

- 2.1. Ground under repair: area's encircled by white lines; the player may take relief under Rule 16.1b, c or d.
- 2.2. Roads covered with gravel or shells are immovable obstructions; the player may take relief under Rule 16.1b. The gravel or shells are loose impediments; the player may remove loose impediments under Rule 15.1a.
- 2.3. Ropes and stakes around greens and tees are immovable obstructions. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1b.

Abnormal course conditions: No Play Zones (Rule 2.4 and Rule 16.1f)

- 3.1. Ground under repair: area's encircled by blue lines or defined by blue stakes; the player must take relief under Rule 16.1f.
- 3.2. The young trees identified by a stake are no play zones. If a player's ball lies on or touches such a tree or such a tree interferes with the player's stance or area of intended swing, the player must take relief under Rule 16.1f.
- 3.3 Wintergreens, when in operation (meaning there is a hole), are no play zones. If the player his ball (not his stance) lies on the wintergreen, the player must take relief under Rule 16.1f. No putting is allowed either.

When Wintergreens are in operation, the summer green is a no play zone.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULE: Stroke play: two penalty strokes: Match play: loss of hole

Preferred lies

When the signboard 'Preferred lies' is in operation, the following local rule applies:

When a player's ball lies in a part of the general area cut to fairway height or less, the player may take free relief once by placing the original ball or another ball in and playing it from a relief area defined as follows:

Reference point: spot of the original ball

Size of relief area: one scorecard length or 6 inches (ca. 15 cm) measured from the reference point, but with following limits:

- must not be nearer the hole than the reference point, and
- must be in the general area.

The fairway is limited by the outside row of sprinklers.

In proceeding under this Local Rule, the player must choose a spot to place the ball and use the procedures for replacing a ball under Rules 14.2b(2) and 14.2e.

PENALTY FOR PLAYING A BALL FROM A WRONG PLACE IN BREACH OF LOCAL RULE 5: General Penalty under Rule 14.7a.

Suspensions of play (Rule 5.7)

A suspension of play will be signalled as follows:

· Immediate suspension : one prolonged note of siren in case of a dangerous situation.

Resumption of play will be signalled by two short notes of siren.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULE 6: Disqualification (Rule 5.7)

Pace of play (Rule 5.6b)

Groups of players are supposed to finish the round within the starting interval of the group in front of them and within the time limit set by the Committee to complete the round as stated on the scorecard. For information, the following time limits apply:

Flights having lost connection with the flight in front of them are required to give priority to the flight behind them on simple request.

Players teeing off on Hole 16 Par 64 have priority on Players teeing off on hole 17 Par.

INFORMATION

Distance markers:

Stake: 150m to the center of the green on the Par 72 100m to the center of the green on the Par 64

Yellow Disk: 150m to the front of the green Red Disk: 100m to the front of the green Blue Disk: 50m to the front of the green

Etiquette

Repair pitch marks, replace divots and rake bunkers. Put the rakes completely in the bunkers. Do not wheel with trolleys between green side bunkers and greens.

Do not wheel with trolleys on the tee's.

Use of roads around greens and tee's are mandatory.

Keep up with the flight in front of you. Avoid Slow Play.

Half-Way House:

- Players are expected to make a short stop at the Half-Way House after completing the ninth hole (11th hole on Par 64) and before starting the tenth hole (12th hole on Par 64)
- Players are expected to keep silence when taking a break at the halfway house, as respect to the players putting or driving on the holes around the Half Way House
- Players should go to the next tee at the latest, when the flight behind is leaving the ninth green (11th green on Par 64).
- No flight finishing the ninth hole (11th hole on Par 64) may go ahead of the flight at the Half Way-House, without their explicit permission.

Dresscode

- Men shirts need to have collars and sleeves, shirts must be tucked in. Ladies shirts must have collars and/or sleeves.
- Men need to wear knee-length smart shorts or tailored long trousers.
- · Shorts must be worn with socks covering the ankle.
- Hats, visors and caps must always be worn with peak forward, and cannot be worn inside the Club House.
- Worn jeans, tracksuits, t-shirts and training shoes are forbidden.
